ALL APPLICATIONS MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

1. Cover letter stating your reasons for wanting to participate in PEP. Please include your preference in teaching either high school, middle school, or elementary school students.
2. Resume or Curriculum Vita (CV).
3. Include a 1-page teaching philosophy that focuses on your values, beliefs, and approaches to teaching and learning.
4. List of courses in the areas of Filipina/x/o American Studies, Asian American Studies, Ethnic Studies, and Education. *You can include an unofficial transcript.
5. List of two references (at least one professor). Include their names, titles, phone numbers, and email addresses.

PEP TEACHER REQUIREMENTS & COMMITMENTS:

- Be in good academic standing.
- 1 year commitment.
- Teaching one or two days a week for about 2 hours.
- PEP Teacher Meetings: Asian American Studies 685/688- Teaching Practicum (7:00-10:00 PM on Wednesdays).
- Participate in all PEP projects, field trips, and fundraisers.
- Be available to participate in at least one speaker series, conference, and/or workshop(s).
- Be available to teach during SF State's Winter & Spring breaks.
- Interviews & Mandatory PEP Training/Retreat.
- If selected, you MUST attend the MANDATORY PEP Summer Tibak Training and Fall and Winter retreats:

WHAT WE ARE LOOKING FOR (BUT NOT LIMITED TO):

- Upper Division undergraduates, recent college graduates, and graduate students majoring, minoring, or have taken: Ethnic Studies, Asian American Studies, education, and/or liberal studies.
- Students who have taken AAS 350, 352, and 353 (At least one Filipina/o American Studies course) at San Francisco State University..
- Students who have worked closely with urban youth.
- Students who are interested in pursuing careers in education and service.
- Students who can speak and/or understand Tagalog or a Filipino language.
- Students who have a strong commitment to social justice.

WHO WE ARE...

The Pin@y (Pinay/Pinoy) Educational Partnerships (PEP) is a service-learning/learning-service program that forms a “triangular partnership” between the university, public schools, and the community to cultivate a barangay (community) to produce critical educators and curriculum at all levels of education and in the community. PEP’s partnership triangle includes: Bay Area colleges/universities, San Francisco public schools, and the Filipino American Development Foundation (FADF). Uniquely, our community implements a transformative decolonizing curriculum and pedagogy, incorporating all grade levels including primary, middle, secondary, post-secondary, and graduate students. As volunteer teachers of the program, graduate and undergraduate students, from San Francisco State University (SFSU) and surrounding universities who are pursuing careers in education or community service, receive a unique opportunity to teach critical Filipina/x/o American studies. They gain skills in the practice of critical pedagogy, culturally relevant & responsive pedagogy, curriculum development, lesson planning, and teaching.
